Course Description

This 16-week course is designed to introduce the student to the basics of music theory. No previous knowledge of music is required. The course will cover the following topics:

- Staves, clefs, and notes
- Rhythm and meter
- Major and minor scales
- Intervals
- Triads and seventh chords and their basic functions
- Introduction to functional harmony: the predominant, dominant, and tonic; phrases and cadences

The purpose of the course is to better equip those who serve in the music ministry at Grace Immanuel Bible Church, although enrollment is open to all regular attenders. The majority of the 45-minute class time will be lecture format with time for questions. There will be weekly assignments posted online. There will also be supplemental resources available online and in print, both for written exercises and listening examples.

Evaluation

For those taking the class for pre-college credit, grades will be calculated as follows:

- Homework (completion only, not graded): 40%
- Attendance: 40%
- Exam: 20%

Letter grades will be assigned on a ten-point scale.
